

Array of Services & Supports for Early On Macomb Children and Families

- ❖ Comprehensive, developmental evaluation & periodic assessment of child, 0-3
- ❖ Service Coordination by staff from Macomb Intermediate School District, Community Mental Health, or Public Health
- ❖ Transition planning and connection with a variety of community resources
- ❖ Access to one or more Play Groups:
 - Sensory Systems provides play activity through one of the following group formats: Arousal, Sensory, and Fussy Baby, facilitated by an Occupational Therapist;
 - Sterling Heights Parks and Recreation offers play and social activities for children with special needs;
 - Early On Macomb staff facilitates *Talk to Me* and *Let's Talk Some More* play groups to support language acquisition and development and the *On Our Way* play groups to support positive parent-child interactions to enhance social-emotional development
- ❖ Connection with other families who are enrolled or have been enrolled in Early On Macomb for mentoring, support and/or leadership training via the Early On Family Liaison
- ❖ Bi-monthly newsletter written by families for families in the Macomb Early On system
- ❖ Monthly Parents Night Out – *Let's Talk About . . .* informal meetings for parents to get together and talk about different topics each month
- ❖ Infant Massage classes for child and parents offered periodically
- ❖ Opportunity to attend Early On in-service or training workshops with staff, as partners in the early intervention system
- ❖ Opportunity to be reimbursed for registration costs associated with attending local or regional conferences
- ❖ “Families Together” events each month coordinated by former Early On parents.
- ❖ Partial or total reimbursement for approved summer recreation classes for children enrolled in Early On, with reimbursement amount determined annually
