


Importing the MICIS file into MISDmsds

The MICIS files are Unicode and not ASCII, therefore there is an issue importing these files into MISDmsds.

The following instructions will allow you to convert the MICIS Unicode file into an ASCII file and import it into the MISDmsds program.

To change the file to ASCII a simple DOS command is used.

C:\> type [unicode file name] > [text file name], as illustrated in the screen shot below.

The type command will perform the conversion, In the sample above data10923.xml was unable to be imported because it is UNICODE encoded. The command above copied data10923.xml to dataNew10923.xml in ASCII.

After running the Unicode to ASCII conversion, open the xml file with notepad and change the first line:

From: <?xml version="1.0" encoding="utf-16"?>

To : <?xml version="1.0" ?>

The New .xml file will import without a problem.
