## HOW TO GET INVOLVED

- Let high school students learn about your company and the career opportunities/pathways your company offers by creating a business profile.
- Develop a relationship with your local high school by serving as a guest speaker, advisory committee member or mock interviewer.
- Provide students with work-based learning opportunities while still in high school (consider it a test drive to see if they will be good future employees).
- \* Provide teachers with the opportunity to see your company, ask you to their career fair or join in Manufacturing Day activities.

- Recent high school graduates and adults seeking new career opportunities can earn their Industrial Readiness Certificate (IRC) by taking nine credits, tuition free.
