Landon- " "The flowers are blooming."


Alex- "You can play outside."


In science we studied land forms. The kids participated in making a volcano and watching it erupt.



The class joined in on the Earth Day activities by cleaning up playground litter and planting and documenting the growth of our Mother's Day seedlings!








