Parents, it has been a pleasure meeting with you at our Fall IEP meetings. Attendance has been phenomenal and we thank you for your support of our program. As you know, IEPs are a great time to discuss student progress and develop goals for the year ahead. If your child's IEP was not held in the fall, rest assured that it will take place sometime throughout the course of the year in accordance with the annual due date.

October was a busy month of learning at Maple Lane. We completed our NWEA assessment which will help us monitor student growth throughout the year. This assessment is unique in that it is an adaptive test that your child took on the computer. Each test is individualized to a student's specific learning level. The information presented on the test is aligned with the Common Core State curriculum, so it helps us design our instruction accordingly.

Students have been hard at work learning new skills in reading, writing, math, social studies and science. I have had the privilege of visiting classrooms to watch students grow as learners and expand their thinking. I am impressed with the ways our teachers and staff use technology to enhance the learning process. For example, educational apps are used on iPads and academic games are used on computers throughout Maple Lane.

Since school has started, we have been learning many social skills in line with our STAR rules: at Maple Lane, we use Safe behavior, we Try our best, we Act Responsibly, and we are Respectful. Students who follow these rules by displaying safe behavior were able to attend some of our awesome field trips. Students can also look forward to bowling trips in December as well as therapy dogs, art and technology classes and other enrichment as well!

R3


In room 3 the students have been busy beavers reviewing and learning new concepts. Also, room 3 students have been learning social skills to help in developing. During reading we identify phonemic sounds, blending and identify sight words. During math we have been reviewing counting forwards and backwards. In addition, we are working on identifying one more and one less than a given number using identify and represent numbers using objects and pictorial representations including the number line, and use the language of: equal to, more than, less than (fewer), most, and least. In language arts we have been writing in our pattern books and working on social skills using the zone curriculum. On Friday's we have been cooking, the students in room 3 have learned new skills in how to measure, tools and ingredients that are involved in the cooking process.



We are off to a great start this 2018-19 school year. We are all getting to know each other and the rules of our classroom and building.


We have been working hard on our math, reading, spelling, science and social studies. We are also doing well in practicing the use of zones and filling buckets.

We also enjoy gym, library and iPad time. We have enjoyed the therapy dog visits.



R5

Room 5 has been busy learning the routines of the classroom and the school. We are working on our STAR behavior daily. The students are learning through our character, Schubert, on how to handle situations when upset or frustrated. We also learned STAR in another way: Smile Take a Breath and Relax. We are remembering to be helpful vs hurtful, using our BIG Voice (not a yelling voice) and being assertive to get our needs met. Example, "I don't like it when...Please stop grabbing my pencil. "Schubert taught us about going from BUG CRAZY mad to Caterpillar CALM. We do this by using some breathing strategies: The Balloon, The Drain, and The Pretzel. We are learning how to identify and deal with our feelings.







We learned about the parts of our brain and how each part has a different function. Each student made and labeled a brain made of play-doh. This is all part of our Growth Mindset studies. Our growth mindset positive affirmation for the month is; "My mistakes help me improve". In September, our affirmation was, "with effort and determination, I can succeed". We say these on a regular basis to help encourage positive thinking and foster a growth mindset. Research shows that students of all ages perform better when they can think with a growth mindset.



Please make sure you are looking at and talking to your student about their daily point card. Communication between parents and teachers is a HUGE factor in a student's success. Encourage the positive choices that your student made throughout the day (taking a break, completing work, participating, etc.) and discuss ways to better handle any negative choices that were made. Your support from home is greatly appreciated!



I know that the days will only get busier as the holidays approach. To keep up with everything going on, be sure to look for the monthly calendar your child will be bringing home in November and December.














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
