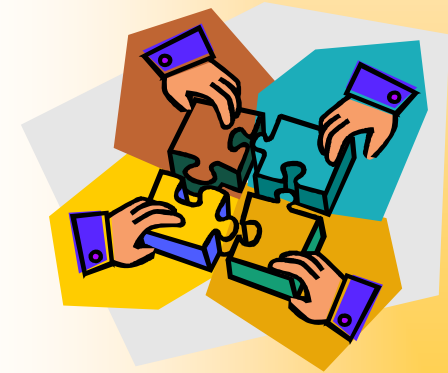

The Reading Apprenticeship® Framework Series

The need for improved reading proficiency among high school students is great. Students need to learn not only to read textbooks and related materials with increased understanding, but also to make reading an important part of their lives beyond the classroom.

Reading Apprenticeship is an approach to reading instruction that helps young people develop their knowledge, strategies, and dispositions they need to become more powerful readers. It is a partnership of expertise, drawing on what teachers know and do as discipline-based readers, and on adolescents' unique and often underestimated strengths as learners.

Teachers will learn the framework for understanding Reading Apprenticeship, based in four dimensions of classroom learning, and will leave with instructional strategies that support content reading development for adolescent learners.
