MAP+ can help secure your workforce for the future. Our outreach to local high school seniors, combined with foundational education and workplace preparation aims to supply high-quality candidates for a career pathway in advanced manufacturing or construction.

BENEFITS of MAP+

- + The Michigan Apprenticeship Program Plus (MAP+) is a grant-funded partnership between Macomb and Grand Rapids Community Colleges.
- + Recent high school graduates and adults seeking new career opportunities can earn their Industrial Readiness Certificate (IRC) by taking nine credits, tuition free.
- + The IRC classes prepare students for a skilled trade, apprenticeship, or similar work-based learning opportunity.
- + Students will experience 17 hours of workplace readiness skills, including interviewing, resumé success, and communication skills.

Hire students

Interview students at our scheduled events, search for resumé on Macomb Career Link or reach out directly to learn more about current availability.

Network with students

Provide opportunities to learn about the industry and available careers at our special events throughout the year.

Provide a tour for students
