Focus

New Michigan Social Studies Standards to be approved in 2018 has the MISD Social Studies team focused on helping teachers understand the expected shifts in instruction (emphasis on disciplinary literacy and thinking skills) and make updates to their curriculum and resources. Professional development in social studies will focus on understanding the new standards (Getting to Know the New SS Standards Workshop) and integrating them into the curriculum. The MISD will support this work through sessions with curriculum developers (K-6 MC3, 6-7 GIANTS, 6-12 DBQ Project), sessions on how to integrate literacy instruction (Secondary Disciplinary Literacy Essentials), and sessions on authentic student inquiry (6-8 *Read.Inquire.Write*, K-12 Inquiry Design Model). Engagement at the elementary level will continue to be a focus as well, with sessions on the Giant Traveling Maps and explorations of best practices in K-4 social studies disciplines.

FOCUS

College Board Suite of Assessments

The Michigan Department of Education (MDE) has transitioned to using the SAT as part of the Michigan Merit Examination. In April 2018, the state will offer the <u>PSAT 8/9</u> to freshmen, the <u>PSAT 10</u> to sophomores, and the <u>SAT</u> to juniors during regular school hours free of charge. **In spring 2019, MDE will require PSAT 8/9 for 8th graders as part of accountability measures.**

NWEA Suite of Assessments

Through an agreement between the 21 districts within the county and Macomb ISD a variety of professional learning opportunities are offered at the regional level to provide support to implement and utilize NWEA Suite of Assessment data appropriately and effectively across the county. NWEA was recently awarded by MDE to be one of the vendors who will provide the state benchmark assessment, which only strengthens the agreement to continue to provide support to districts.

Using Student Growth Percentiles (SPGs) in Teacher Evaluation

Beginning in 2018-19, student growth and assessment data must account for 40% of the annual year-end teacher evaluation. Also beginning in the 2018-2019 school year, for teachers of grades and content areas measured by state assessments (Gr 3 – 8), half of the student growth portion (20%) of the evaluation must be measured by the state assessments. The state will provide Student Growth Percentiles for all applicable students within a district, however the district will be responsible for tracking which student SGP should be linked to individual teachers and aggregating those SGPs. The ISD will provide support in regard to the district responsibilities.

Macomb Assessment, Accountability, Research, and Evaluation Network (AAREN)

Macomb County AAREN is a county-wide reference group. One of the goals of the group is to provide a safe and creative environment to contribute, receive feedback and encouragement as members implement a complex K-12 assessment system within their districts. As well as, for the entire group to build foundational assessment literacy skills. Another goal of the group is to utilize the results from a quality balanced K-12 assessment system to advance student achievement. Discussions around appropriately utilizing assessments for evaluation and accountability needs will be a focus as well as the usage and implementation of NWEA in a K-12 setting. All members will have the opportunity to contribute to the agenda of each meeting. Members are a leader, at any level, who influences the implementation and usage of K-12 assessment and data within their district.

Ongoing Supports:

State Accountability and Assessment System

The state assessment system is expanding and changing beyond the accountability measures to include initial, extensive and benchmark assessments.

Recently the state released a new accountability index system, which reports the degree to which schools are meeting performance targets in six areas required by ESSA. The areas are student proficiency, student growth, graduation rate, English Learner progress, school quality/ student success, and assessment participation. A school's index value can range from 0-100, with a score of 100 indicating a school has met or exceeded targets in every area and for each student subgroup. The Index System will identify low-performing schools in three

federally required categories: Comprehensive Support and Improvement (CSI), Targeted Support and Improvement (TSI), and Additional Targeted Support (ATS).
