What is *Early On*®?

Early On® is a Michigan program for infants and toddlers, ages birth to three, who need supports and services due to a “developmental delay”. Having a developmental delay means it takes a child a little longer to learn basic skills.

A child may have a developmental delay in one of the following areas:

- Thinking
- Talking
- Hearing
- Seeing
- Moving
- Taking care of basic needs
(such as eating and/or dressing)
- Responding to others
- Interacting with others

Early On® Mission & Vision

Mission: **Early On**® builds upon and provides supports and resources to assist family members and caregivers to enhance eligible children’s learning and development through everyday learning opportunities.

Vision: Infants and toddlers who are enrolled in **Early On**® reach their fullest potential, successfully transitioning to the next phase of life, with empowered and supportive families.

What Does **Early On**® Look Like?

We know it isn’t easy to raise a child who needs help. **Early On**® is designed to build on a child’s strengths. **Early On**® emphasizes **early identification** and **early referral** to enhance the development of eligible infants and toddlers to minimize their potential for delay, and to recognize the significant brain development that occurs during a child’s first three years of life.

Children learn best from their parents and caregivers in everyday activities like diapering, bathing, eating meals, dressing, shopping and playing with siblings. **Early On**® providers work closely with parents and caregivers by providing guidance and support on these everyday learning opportunities found in daily routines and activities.

Intervention = comes from the child’s natural caregivers, who are usually parents and other caregivers. Parents and caregivers provide the most effective practice, encouragement, and guidance for their children.

Service = professional activities (coaching) from **Early On**® providers to ensure parents have interventions they can use all the time between visits, when a child’s learning really happens.

In order to accomplish the goal of empowering and supporting families, **Early On**® providers use a coaching approach with families. Parents and caregivers know their children best and know what works best for their families; therefore, parents’ knowledge and expertise are extremely valuable and needed.

In this coaching relationship, the provider and parent work together to develop goals and practice techniques that will help children achieve common goals. Regular discussions guide the direction of services and allow providers to ensure they are meeting the diverse needs of all children.

TALK READ SING

When you talk, read, and sing with your child, you're strengthening your bond with them and helping them learn. Research shows that talking, reading and singing every day from birth builds their brain as well as important language, math, reading and social emotional skills.

Here are some ideas but use your own! You are your child's best teacher.

Let's Talk!

Everywhere you go, talk about what you see. Talk about the trees, the flowers in your yard, the color of your shirt, the food on your plate. Talking about what children see builds their brains and vocabularies.

Share back and forth conversations. Take turns listening and speaking. When you keep the conversation going, you're developing language skills and showing your child that their words are important.

Talk together. Enjoy sharing fun stories or memories from your childhood.

Let's Read!

You can **inspire a love of books** and words in your child by reading or telling a story together every day.

Engage with a book. **Point out pictures.** "Look, the car is red, just like Mom's car."

Ask open ended questions as you share the book together. "What do you see?" "How does he feel?" "What would you do if you were her?"

Read the same books again if your child wants to. **Repetition helps.**



Let's Sing!

Sing your favorite song or make one up. Clap, tap, stomp, and dance along. Your child loves to hear your voice even if you can't carry a tune!

Build learning through singing. "You live at 123, Maple Street!"

Sing all the time, during everyday activities. "I'm driving the car, driving the car, driving the car, to the grocery store!"

Create your own lullaby when snuggling for bedtime. Sing about what you did during the day or things you love about your child.

Let's Talk About Math!

Your child begins developing math skills from birth through daily routines and activities you share together. **Math is all around us!**

Count everything! Count the number of the blue socks in the laundry basket, Count the number of traffic lights along the way. Count as you talk, play, and explore together!

Add it up! Experiment adding or removing objects from a group. Add one more block to the block tower your child is building and ask your child how many?

Practice measurement with cooking. Your kitchen is rich with yummy ways to learn the basics. "Is the cup full or empty?" "Is the carrot long or short?"

Explore with shapes and objects of different sizes. At home, outside or at the grocery store, describe the shape and sizes of objects all around you. "Let's cut your sandwich into two triangles" or "the orange is a sphere".

Let's Talk About Science!

Children are curious about the world. They want to know how things float, how birds fly, why leaves change colors.

Make observations, describe animals and plants, talk about the weather.

Explore the world through your child's senses. "How does it feel?" "How does it taste?" "What does it smell like?"

Ask questions! It's **OK** if you don't have all the answers - Let your child know "we can find out together!"

It's all **science!**

Let's Talk About STEM!

(Science, Technology, Engineering and Math)

STEM is the process of using math, science and technology to create, innovate or solve a problem.

Give your child safe, everyday materials like cardboard, tubes, string, fabric and tape. **Allow your child to get creative** and work together to build and problem solve!

Let's be scientists! Ask questions that encourage observation and description. Mix colors together to make a new one. Exploring together builds skills for future scientists!

Children learn about **engineering and technology** through their own exploration and by talking, watching, and playing with you!

Let's Talk About Social-Emotional!

Parenting is a journey! Take time to connect with your child each day. Your loving care will help them feel safe, secure, and confident.

Create a predictable, nurturing environment. Children feel secure in knowing what is happening next.

Listen and respect your child. Show them you care about what they are saying.

Set clear, consistent limits. Recognize and celebrate positive behavior - it builds your child's confidence and encourages them to repeat these behaviors.

Tune in. What makes your child happy? Sad? Excited? Take time to connect and think about where these feelings come from.

Set limits and point out consequences of your child's behaviors. **Use difficult moments as opportunities to teach better ways for next time!**

Be sensitive, nurturing and encouraging. They are beginning to understand their own development so give your child encouragement and patience!

Be kind to yourself. There is no such thing as a perfect parent so be gentle with yourself. Take care of you too!



Tips for Using Native Language

Speaking multiple languages provides a great benefit to young children! Children who switch between two languages have very **active and flexible brains!**

Use your native language at home. Children can easily learn several languages at the same time!

Tell stories and sing songs. Stories, chants, rhymes and songs from your childhood are an important part of their heritage. Share these with your child and have fun!

Share books together. Read a book to your child every day-in whatever language you feel most comfortable with.

Check out materials from the library. Look for books, DVD's and music in your language.
