In room 3, we have been busy with reading, math and language groups. First, in reading we have been as a group reading books about The First Thanksgiving & and The Pilgrims. Second, in math class we have been counting 1 to 100. Also adding single digit numbers. Third, in Language Arts we have been working on our opposite packet and our pattern books for Thanksgiving & Christmas. Finally, we have been cooking on Fridays, students have learned how to make frosting, pumpkin pies, stone soup, and homemade bread.



R4 has had a busy November and beginning of December. We really enjoyed the visit with the therapy dogs. We met new dogs and loved seeing the regular visitors too!

The students have moved ahead in math. They are working on multiplication and measurement. In social studies, we have been learning about Native Americans and the symbols they used to write out their stories.

We have been working hard on Zones of Regulation. The students have been identifying their feelings. They are using those skills and tools to work through each of their moments.

We have been learning about history of the USA and Michigan in particular. Our Earth studies have taken us down to the core. We have been learning about Earth. Our class has been working on being a good friend. Charlotte's Web is our read aloud. We are learning about friendship, and having some great classroom discussions about what makes a good friend. This also correlates with our zones, being able to look at cues and how to be helpful instead of hurtful.

We have been busy this fall!! This week, we started the novel Holes by Louis Sachar. We are using this book to analyze characters and study descriptive text. For enjoyment, we are also reading I Survived: Pearl Harbor during our classroom read aloud time.

During our whole group math lessons, we are wrapping up our unit on multiplying/dividing fractions and decimals. These lessons were done primarily as a whole group. Students also participate in small group math instruction to work on individualized skills and concepts.

We are continuing to study the "Zones of Regulation" as part of our social skills instruction. The students have been charting which zone they are in during the various activities throughout the day. This is to help them be aware of when they are experiencing different emotions and when they are using tools to help regulate these emotions. I am pleased to say the students are learning to be honest and self-reflect. In the next few sessions, we will try out different 'tools' and work to help the students recognize when to use a tool and what tool(s) work best for them.



R7

In November, room 7 has continued reading The Wizard of Oz in our reading book. We enjoy comparing what we are reading in the book to what we watched in the movie and discussing the differences. In math, we have worked on rounding numbers to the nearest ten, hundred, and thousand. We have also been working on multiplication and finding the greatest common factor. In writing, we wrote "How to Cook a Turkey", and made a "Christmas Wish List for Santa", in addition to our regular journal topics. We had several students complete their first handwriting books, including LaMari, Tim, Christian, and Jamel. In science, we learned how to stay healthy and not spread our germs. We also learned some of the differences between a cold and the flu. In social studies, we learned about the history of Veteran's Day and why we celebrate it. We read about early explorers and also about Native Americans. It was a very busy month and now we are eagerly looking forward to the upcoming holidays in December.





We are busy at work here in R-10. Moving right along with our Moving with Math books, and working extra hard on our multiplication facts, we are excited to head into the New Year with more Math knowledge! We continue our reading journey with many novel readings such as; Jigsaw Jones, White House Christmas Mystery, and daily whole group readings of Treasure Island and rounded out November with Hyperlinking through the Solar System. We were even able to create our own solar system, which you can view outside our classroom.

We are ready for the Holiday season, and working on December's Hall of Fame focus: RESPECT!
