Dear Macomb Intermediate School District Families and Colleagues:

We are pleased to announce that the Macomb Intermediate School District has partnered with Henry Ford Health Systems to host a COVID-19 Vaccination Clinic to be available on Tuesday, May 25<sup>th</sup>, and Thursday, May 27<sup>th</sup>, from 9:00 a.m. to 4:00 p.m. The Clinic will be located at the Educational Service Center (44001 Garfield Road in Clinton Township). This opportunity is available for our students with special needs and their immediate families, along with MISD staff and their families. This clinic will be administering the Pfizer vaccine, which is available to individuals 12 years of age and older. The Pfizer vaccine requires two doses at least 21 days apart. Students under the age of 18 must be accompanied by a parent or legal guardian, in order to receive both doses of the vaccine. Enclosed with this letter, you will find the registration information. If you need assistance with transportation to the Vaccine Clinic, please contact your building principal or administrator for assistance.

We want to thank all of you who have been following the COVID-19 safety protocols that have been established during this pandemic. Our pandemic protocols and the vaccines have contributed to the successful operations in our schools and programs, allowing us to provide in-person learning and other instructional models to meet the needs of our students and families. Late last week, the Center for Disease Control (CDC) and Michigan Department of Health and Human Services (MDHHS) revised their guidance on gatherings and masking for those who have been fully vaccinated. However, the CDC and the Macomb County Health Department continue to recommend that schools follow the masking protocols for the remainder of the 20-21 school year. We will continue to monitor this as more information becomes available.

Although there is a reduction in COVID -19 cases, there will continue to be a few staff and students who will be required to quarantine. Since the pandemic began, the 21 superintendents in the county and the MISD have and will continue to meet with the Macomb County Health Department. Together, we will consistently evaluate the situation and be in communication with you if any changes to our protocols are needed.

We want to thank you again for your support, patience, and all you are doing to help keep our schools as safe and healthy as possible. We want you to feel confident in your decision to have your student(s) and/or family member(s) vaccinated, and we welcome any questions you may have.
