## What

Create or record a family project that conveys your interpretation of the 2021 MLK Holiday Celebration theme: **Be Brave, Be Bold, Be Courageous.** This project can be creatively completed via art, music, spoken word, storytelling, photography, etc.

Before starting your project, take a moment and really think about all we have endured in 2020. Imagine that your family has been selected to portray 2020 to the world!

## How

Here's what you need to do:

- Submit your entry by December 4, 2020
- This is a family collaboration project so you must have at least 2 members of your family participating to qualify.

- You must submit your entry, digitally, in a single email to <u>342021mlk@gmail.com</u>
- Only projects attached in the email will be considered
  - In the body of the email; include your NAME, AGE, EMAIL ADDRESS, HOME ADDRESS, PHONE NUMBER, SCHOOL NAME, SCHOOL DISTRICT NAME

#### The Selection Process

- The Family Collaboration Project will be judged by the 2021 MLK Holiday Celebration Planning Committee. Judging is based on five categories: 1) quality 2) creativity 3) impact, 4) adherence to the theme, and 5) following our rules.
- Something to Think About: The first phase of judging will be on the quality of your submission. Be mindful that the finalist will be presented during the MLK Celebration event and the judges will be looking for examples that demonstrates creativity that will "wow" viewers. We encourage you to create your best work and have fun.

#### Prizes

- The winning family will receive a cash prize of \$100 and
- A Civil Rights Library Collection donated to their school library

#### **Other Rules**

- 1. All submissions must conform to your school and district policies regarding appropriate content
- 2. Projects submitted after the December 4, 2020 deadline will not be accepted
- 3. Entrants agree to be bound by the official contest rules and decisions of the judges
