- All photos must be taken and edited with mobile devices (smartphones, or phones by any operating system, or tablets
- Photos may only be edited using software available on a mobile device
- Format: jpeg
- Minimum dimension: 640 pixels on the biggest side
- File Size: larger that 100k and smaller than 7MB
- NO images that are embedded on the email
- NO images with boarders, frames watermarks
- Confirmation emails will be sent to every participant after they have submitted an entry

The submissions will not be returned

The Selection Process

- Finalists will be selected by a panel that includes representatives from Anton Art Center
- The decision of the judges is final
